1. What is the Anti-Christ’s secret strategy to deceive the world at the end of time?

- Bible Answer from Daniel 7:25 - *“And he shall speak great words against the most High, and shall wear out the saints of the most High, and think to _____ times and _____.”*
- Revelation 12:17 - *“And the dragon was enraged with the woman, and he went to make war with the rest of her offspring, who _____ the _____ of God and have the testimony of Jesus Christ.”*

Note: The goal of the Anti-Christ at the end of time is to change and attack the commandments of God. We will find out why in this study!

2. What is the first part of the Three Angels’ Messages that is also vital for us to understand and do to avoid end-time deception?

- Bible Answer from Revelation 14:7 - *“_____ God and give _____ to Him, for the hour of His judgement is come.”*
- Ecclesiastes 12:13 - *“Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter: Fear God and _____ His commandments...”*

Note: To fear God does not mean to be afraid of Him. Rather, it means to be in awe of His greatness and majesty. It means to respect Him and obey Him out of love for His goodness rather than to fear His wrath.

3. How do the 10 Commandments benefit us when we keep them without compromise in our lives?

- Bible Answer from Proverbs 29:18 - *“_____ is he who keeps the law.”*
- Proverbs 3:1-2 - *“Keep my commands, for length of days and long _____ and peace they will add to you.”*
- Psalm 119:165 - *“Great _____ have those who love Your law, And nothing shall offend them.”*

Note: The Bible says (Old and New Testament) that the commandments have wonderful benefits for our lives. They protect us from unwise decisions and unneeded pain when we obey them. They promise to bring long life because of their blessing. They are actually 10 promises that God gives to us personally! They demonstrate His own faithfulness in our lives!

Commandments (Exodus 20:1-17):	Personal Promise from God:
1) “You shall have no other gods before Me.”	I will never put anything in front of you...not even my own life/existence.
2) “You shall not make for yourself a graven image...you shall not bow down to them nor serve them.”	I am greater than anything your hands can create. I am not limited to stone or wood. My presence is everywhere; therefore I am always with you wherever you are.
3) “You shall not take the name of the LORD your God in vain...”	I am giving you my name - something that is precious to me. Treat it as your own. Represent me well.
4) “Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy...the 7th day is the Sabbath of the Lord your God...”	In me, you find your rest. I have given you a day to rest to remind you that I am your Creator and Redeemer. I alone can give you physical, mental, emotional, and spiritual rest.
5) “Honor your father and your mother...”	Honor your parents as you would me. Treat them as you would me. They are a representation of my authority.
6) “You shall not murder.”	I gave you breath of life upon this earth. That means I have placed value on you personally. I am asking you to value the lives of others as I have valued yours.
7) “You shall not commit adultery.”	I will always be faithful to you. Be faithful to Me and each other just as I have done for you.
8) “You shall not steal.”	I will always provide for your needs. I will always provide enough.

Commandments (Exodus 20:1-17):	Personal Promise from God:
9) "You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor."	I will always tell you the truth. I will never lie to you. Don't lie to me or to each other. Put your life in my hands and believe I will always work things for your good.
10) "You shall not covet anything that is your neighbor's."	I am everything you will ever need. I don't love you more than anyone else or anyone else more than you. Trust that I will give you exactly what you need when you need it.

4. What is one of the primary roles of God's law that impacts us personally?

Bible Answer from Romans 3:20 - *"Therefore by the deeds of the law no flesh will be justified in His sight, for by the law is the _____ of sin."*

Note: No one can be saved through keeping the commandments, but the commandments are necessary to reveal sin in our lives and help us sense our need of Jesus who alone can cleanse us.

5. What is the Bible's definition of sin?

• Bible Answer from 1 John 3:4 - *"Whosoever committeth sin transgresseth also the law: for _____ is the transgression of the law."*

Note: Beyond the shadow of a doubt, no other power comes close to fulfilling all of these points. Please consider the intelligent evidence. Once again, this is not talking about people, but a system.

6. Are we saved by keeping God's commandments?

• Bible Answer from Ephesians 2:8-9 - *"For by _____ you have been saved through faith, and not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, not of works, lest anyone should boast."*

7. What are some of the Devil's attacks on the 10 Commandments at the end of time to attempt to get people to disregard God's law?

Devil's Attack:	Bible Answer:
1) The Ten Commandments are too restrictive.	"For this is the love of God, that we keep His commandments. And His commandments are not _____." 1 John 5:3-4
2) We don't need to keep the 10 Commandments anymore because we are under grace.	"Do we then make void the law through faith? Certainly not! On the contrary, we _____ the law." Romans 3:31
3) The 10 Commandments were done away with at the cross when Jesus died. They are now outdated.	"Do _____ think that I came to destroy the Law or the Prophets. I did not come to destroy but to fulfill. For assuredly, I say to you, till heaven and earth pass away, one jot or one tittle will by no means pass from the law till all is fulfilled." Matthew 5:17-18
4) Jesus taught that we only need to obey the two new Great Commandments - not all 10.	Matthew 22:36-40. "On these two commandments hang _____ the Law and the Prophets." (vs 40)
5) Jesus kept the commandments, so we don't need to.	"If you love Me, _____ My commandments." John 14:15
6) The Commandments are impossible to keep.	"I can do all things through _____ which strengthens me." Philippians 4:13
7) I'm led by the Spirit, so it's not necessary for me to keep the commandments.	"However, when He, the Spirit of truth, has come, He will guide you into all _____. Thy Word is truth." John 16:13/John 17:17

• Bible Answer from Revelation 14:12 - *"Here is the patience of the saints; here are those who keep the _____ commandments of God and the faith of Jesus."*
